1st Season with Windigo

Blake Hietala enters his first season as head coach of the Wisconsin Windigo. He was previously an assistant coach for the Green Bay Gamblers (United States Hockey League).

Hietala was the architect of a highly effective Gamblers' power-play for two seasons and assisted in the scouting and evaluation of future talent. Prior to joining the Gamblers, he served as an assistant coach and Director of Scouting with the USHL Madison Capitols for the 2017-18 season.

As a player, Hietala was a member of the NCAA Division I Michigan Tech Huskies for five seasons. After overcoming injuries early in his college career, he became a valuable member of the Huskies contributing key goals on a Michigan Tech team that was ranked No. 1 in the nation for a time during Blake's tenure.

Hietala finished his Michigan Tech career with 81 games played having scored 16 goals and 19 assists totaling 35 points.

After graduation, Hietala played 104 professional games, splitting time between the ECHL and Southern Professional Hockey League. He scored 14 goals and 14 assists in 48 games for the Louisiana IceGators. Hietala retired as a player in 2017.

Hietala played junior hockey for the Bismark Bobcats in 2007-08. He split that season with the Ojibwe Eagles 18U AAA (NLHL). He also played for the Melfort Mustangs (SJHL) from 2008-10.

Casey Kirley was hired as Assistant Coach by the Windigo on May 1, 2022. Casey comes to the team after serving in a similar capacity with the Minnesota Magicians during the 2021 season, prior to the team's move to Eagle River, Wisconsin.

Prior to joining the Magicians, he most recently served as the Assistant Coach and Director of Recruiting with Trine University (NCAA).

Kirley also served as the Assistant Coach for the Shreveport Mudbugs (NAHL) from 2017-2019. While with the Mudbugs, the team won the South Division Regular Season and Playoff titles, en route to winning the Robertson Cup National Championship in 2018.

Previously, Kirley served as the Assistant Coach/Assistant GM of the North Iowa Bulls (NA3HL), helping them to Central Division Regular Season and Playoff titles during both the 2016 and 2017 seasons. The Bulls advanced to the Fraser Cup National Championship in both seasons, winning the league in 2016.

Kirley's first year coaching came with the Great Falls Americans (NA3HL) during the 2015 season. The team won the Frontier Division regular season and playoff titles, advancing to the Fraser Cup National Championship.

He also previously served as a scout with the Sioux Falls Stampede (USHL) and the Austin Bruins (NAHL). The Hayward, Wisconsin, native played two seasons of junior hockey in the NAHL, before playing collegiately at UW-Stout (NCHA).

Justin DeMartino joined the Windigo as Head Scout in May of 2022. He commenced his first season as Head Coach of the Fox Motors U18 Program with the start of 2022-23 season.

Prior to joining Fox Motors, Justin most recently served as the Video Coach for the Grand Rapids Griffins in the AHL. A native of Macomb, Michigan, DeMartino served as the assistant coach for the Youngstown Phantoms of the United States Hockey League during the 2020-21 campaign. DeMartino previously

spent three years primarily as the associate head coach with the Topeka Pilots (NAHL). He was the team's interim head coach for most of 2017-18 and added director of scouting duties in 2019-20. DeMartino also has experience in the college ranks with Ferris State University, where he served as an assistant coach and video coordinator during the 2016-17 season. DeMartino graduated from Ferris State in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in communications with a focus on sports communications.

During his four-year playing career as a Bulldog, DeMartino scored 12 goals, 25 assists totaling 37 points. The right winger helped the Bulldogs capture the Central Collegiate Hockey Association's regular-season championship in 2011-12. Leading up to Ferris State, Justin played youth hockey for Detroit Little Caesars and was able to capture back to back National Championships in 2008 and 2009. Following the 2009 season, DeMartino was selected with the first overall pick in the 2009 USHL Entry Level Draft.



The Dome is the first indoor hockey arena built in the state of Wisconsin. It was added to the U.S. National Register of Historic Places in 2018.

It serves as the home of the Wisconsin Hockey Hall of Fame.

Designed by German immigrant architect and engineer Max Hanisch Sr. The Dome was constructed by local volunteers and community residents.

The roof framing is a wooden lamella design, using solid-sawn timbers interconnected in a unique honeycomb pattern.[3] The facility is affectionately referred to as "The Dome" because of its dome-like shape. It has received major renovations once, in 1963-1964, when new locker rooms, indoor plumbing, and a concession stand were added.



The Dome is also the home venue for the North American Hockey League's Wisconsin Windigo (Junior A): local high school hockey team, the Northland Pines Eagles; the ERRA Youth Hockey Association: the Great Lakes Hockey League's Eagle River Falcons (semi-pro); and the Wisconsin Hockey Hall of Fame.
